Russ Bradchulis and Souraya Lorienz each started out dancing in their hometown bars around 2010 and began competing in the UCWDC in 2016 with different partners. They met a couple of years later at Paradise Country Dance Festival when Russ famously missed a restart on a line dance during warmups — a story they still enjoy telling today.

Russ and Souraya teamed up to compete together in 2022 and quickly moved up to Division 2 in the UCWDC, where they continue to compete in Couples and Line Dance. Souraya has also partnered with Russ in teaching workshops at various regional and local events.

They will be teaching Country Waltz for us on Sunday, May 4, and it promises to be both informative and entertaining. Come learn from two of the best and take your Country Waltz to the next level!

May 24 — Demetre "Meech" Souliotis Advanced WCS Workshop





Demetre Souliotes' love of dance first manifested itself at a young age in the form of Hip-Hop and Break Dancing. By age 13, he was competing, battling and winning in three different styles of Hip Hop. Demetre found West

Coast Swing, a dance that introduced him to the unique joys of partner dancing while still allowing the same freedoms of individual creativity, self-expression and musicality that he enjoys with Hip Hop. Dance, West Coast Swing in particular, quickly became an all-encompassing passion,

Within 2 years on the competition circuit, he was asked to partner with one of the top champion dancers of the day, Beata Howe. Demetre and Beata traveled the USA full time on the WCS professional circuit competing, performing, teaching and then capping the year with a 6th place finish at the US Open Swing Dance Championships.

Following that explosive start as a WCS Dance Professional, Demetre traveled the world competing, performing, teaching, judging and choreographing. He spent 4 years teaching all over Asia and started the WCS community in China.

When he isn't busy traveling, Demetre teaches and hosts classes and dances all over Southern California. In 2014, Demetre and his new partner, Kristen Humphrey, placed top 12 in the Classic Division at the US Open Swing Dance Championships. When asked, Demetre describes his style of WCS as focused on a base of micro connection, clear lead and silent conversation to create the framework in which free body movement and expression can take place – along with a touch of Hip Hop for good measure.

Through the last decade, his style has evolved from the inspiration of his Hip Hop roots, his friends in Lindy Hop, his amazing peers in the WCS community and the natural evolution of this amazing street dance called West Coast Swing.


Getting to Know Each Other Better Interviews with Meredith Anderson

Meet Mark Siprut A Lifelong Lover of Dance and the Arts

Mark Siprut's lifelong passion for dance began at an early age. Born in Los Angeles and raised in the LA South Bay area, Mark's parents enrolled him in tap classes when he was ten years old. By age twelve, he was also learning social dance and square dancing at a local park, setting the

stage for a life filled with rhythm and movement.

During his teenage years in the late 1960s, Mark found himself drawn to the Motown and soul music that dominated local dances in his community.




His love of dance only deepened during college at Humboldt State University, where he discovered international folk dancing, with a special emphasis on Balkan styles. His enthusiasm led him to join several performance groups, and after graduating, he moved to Hawaii, where he picked up the hand drum, the dumbek, and performed



Balkan music with a small ensemble.

Mark's commitment to both the arts and education continued to grow. He taught Art and Photography at Iolani High School in Honolulu before earning his MFA in Art at the University of California, Santa Barba-

ra. While in Santa Barbara, he continued playing Balkan music but, more importantly for his dance journey, he discovered Lindy Hop swing dancing. He took classes from notable instructors Jonathan Bixby and Sylvia Sykes, cementing his lifelong love of dance. In 1987, Mark moved to San Diego and began teaching multimedia design at San Diego State University (SDSU), where he remains on the faculty today as an Associate Professor. In 1996, he



grant, further enriching his intercultural experiences.

Upon arriving in San Diego, Mark searched for Lindy Hop dances but instead found a vibrant West Coast Swing community. In the late 1980s and early 1990s, he danced regularly



with the San Diego Swing Dance Club downtown, where live bands played every Sunday night. After the dances,



he and a group of fellow enthusiasts would often head to the Belly Up Tavern to continue dancing to blues bands.

Today, dancing at the San Diego Swing Dance Club remains one of the highlights of Mark's week. His enduring passion for

dance, especially swing, is a vital part of his life and continues to bring him joy and community connection.

In addition to dancing, Mark is a multimedia artist, designer, and educator. His creative work spans photography, printmaking, digital media, and interactive art. His art explores the intersection of natural landscapes and human-made environments, capturing the tension and beauty of cultural and environmental change. Mark's work has been exhibited locally and internationally, and he is the author of The Adobe Photoshop Handbook v3, published by Random House.

Currently, Mark continues to immerse himself in his innovative art and his spirited dancing,
