Passenger killed in crash was La Mesa man

SAN DIEGO — Authorities have publicly identified a 77-year-old man who was killed last week in a traffic crash near San Diego International Airport.

Peter Felber of La Mesa was a front-seat passenger in a Toyota sedan that collided with a charter bus shortly before 5:30 p.m. on June 26 while traveling west on North Harbor Drive at Harbor Island Drive, according to the county Medical Examiner's Office.

Paramedics took Felber to UCSD Medical Center in Hillcrest, where he was pronounced dead about two hours after the crash.

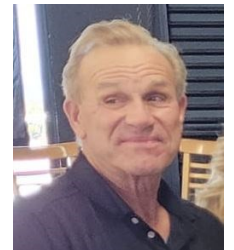
## From Our Dance Director Geoff Burns

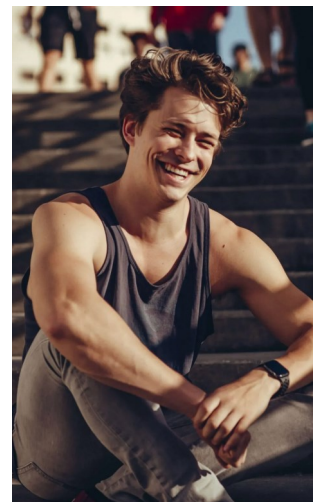

## Getting to Know Each Other Better Interviews with Meredith Anderson



In order for us to get to know each other better, I'm starting a new article about one member each month. This month it's Adam Sumilong who I believe is our youngest member.

*What is your age ?*

I turned 23 this past March.

*Where are you from originally. Does your family live here?*

I'm originally from Cohutta, Georgia — a small town in north Georgia. My family is still there and I moved out here to San Diego a year ago.

*What got you started dancing?*

No big story here — I got handed a flyer my first year in college to try the ballroom dance club, then went to a separate club's Lindy hop social, and by then I was hooked. I competed with the ballroom club then when about a year before I graduated I got introduced to the Westie social scene and the rest is history.

*Do you do other dances?*

I can do 16-dance for ballroom (American + International style dances, minus Bolero and Paso Doble). I'm also trying to get more involved with the vintage swing dances like Lindy hop, Charleston, and Balboa. Also I'm wanting to get more experience in Zouk.

*What do you do in your life outside of dancing?  
(Work, school, hobbies.)*

I'm a software engineer at Qualcomm, and outside of dance, I still do a lot of music related things — I play

piano, saxophone, guitar, etc. Otherwise I like axe-throwing and crafting hobbies like woodcarving, watchmaking, leather working, and some other needlework/sewing projects. Basically I despise having idle hands.

*What are your dance goals?*

Definitely in the short-term I'm wanting to just continue grinding out events to get as far up in the WSDC divisions as possible. In terms of long-term goals I want to just keep on getting more experience in all the other styles of dance, partner or solo, to see what all techniques/philosophies I can gain and utilize in my own dancing. Eventually I also want to maybe begin doing more things as a community leader and just being more involved in the actual Westie community but that's far out in the future, since I'm only just now realizing how much one's community and environment can affect their experience with the dance itself.

*What is your competition history?*

I competed with my college Dancesport team, but I only started competing West Coast Swing 2 years ago at Atlanta Swing Classic 2022, and I'm currently in the WSDC Intermediate division. Half the fun of the events is the travel in my opinion, so I'm happy that I've gotten to check out places all over the US for these events — Georgia, North Carolina, Texas, SoCal, Washington, and hopefully many more destinations to come!
